

The entire family feels the impact of a child with an emotional, behavioral, or mental health challenge. All socio-economic, educational, racial, and religious groups are affected, as are single parents, two-parent households, and birth, adoptive, and foster families.

Families need accurate assessments, evidence-based interventions, culturally and linguistically competent services, and a variety of other resources to help their children become self-respecting, independent, hopeful and productive adults.

Many families face barriers to accessing needed services, such as the lack of child care and after school programs, no transportation, and limited access to high quality, culturally competent mental health services. They must learn to cope with the difficult and demanding behaviors of their children while trying to maintain their employment and financial survival. They often face staggering costs for services.

The Federation works to ensure that family members are treated as equal partners at every level of decision-making. The Federation promotes a family-driven, culturally competent, youth-guided, and community-based system of care. Our organization promotes the wraparound process and encourages ongoing research on children's mental health.

Almost 21 percent of U.S. children ages 9 to 17 have a diagnosable mental or addictive disorder associated with at least minimum impairment. About 11% of the children in the United States have mental health or addictive disorders that cause significant functional impairment. Five percent have problems that cause extreme functional impairment.

Causes of these problems are not well known and include biological and environmental factors. A wide range of therapeutic, educational, social and recreational services are essential to address the needs of these children and their families.
